Does online cheating count?

Only 46% of men believe that online affairs are adultery.[2]

Facebook is being cited in almost one in five of online divorce petitions, lawyers have claimed. [4]

The research comes after UK divorce site Divorce-Online found that 20% of divorce petitions submitted to its database contained the word Facebook. [5]



FOUND SPOUSE MOBILE CHEATING

The number one mistake made by spouses is still mobile-related;

over 61% of those surveyed said a text message had, at some point, either incriminated them totally or aroused suspicion about their affair. [5]



MEN

5% Would Cheat 3% Have Cheated

HE SAID: More than 5% of men are very likely cheat on their current partner if there's no chance she'd find out. Less than 3% of men have cheated on their current partner. [6]

Additionally, 46% of men said that the appeal to cheating on their partner with a trashy woman (think Tiger Woods) is that the mistress may do things in the bedroom that men otherwise wouldn't dare ask a girlfriend or wife to do.



WOMEN

2% Would Cheat 5% Have Cheated

SHE SAID: Even if there was no chance their current partner would find out, less than 2% of women would be "very likely" to cheat. But 5% of women admit to having cheated on their current partner. [6]
